Lent

It all begins with a splash of ashes and something about “ I am dust and to dust I shall return” and then we head off into forty days of ... of what?

For some, it's just another forty days. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday...

For some, it's forty days going without something that they believe that going without for forty days will help them be better followers of Jesus and better people. (I used to give up caffeine for Lent but then decided I would give up the forty-day headache that I had due to caffeine withdrawal instead.)

For some, it's forty days with an added spiritual discipline like daily journaling, meditation, prayer.

For some, it's forty days of awareness of the needs of the world.

I've always found it odd that the folks who practice some sort of Lenten discipline end up doing so as winter gives way to spring. While crocuses are defiantly pushing their way through the snow, Lent-practicing people close their eyes in prayer. While birds greet the spring morning with joy, giving-up-chocolate folks are grumbling past the M&M's aisle. While spring rains begin to wash away winter's grime, we still carry around the grit of ashes – if not on our forehead, on our thoughts and in our souls.

Like New Year's resolutions, we often step into our Lenten practices with gusto. On Shrove Tuesday we drink up all the coffee in the house and then on Ash Wednesday, it's cold turkey and frequent trips to the aspirin bottle. It's no surprise that, by the time Easter comes around, we are asking for forgiveness for not being better disciplined with our Lenten disciplines. I think we go about it backwards. I think it's about taking steps into something that will strengthen our faith.

We get the word “Lent” from an old English word (*lente*) which literally means “lengthen” and corresponds with the lengthening days of spring – the season of Lent.

It's not so much about what we give up or what we add but how we engage in a practice that will lead to a lengthening of our spirits, a strengthening of our faith, a deepening of our commitment to follow in the way of Christ.

When Lent begins this year, on February 22, the sun will rise at 6:43 am and set at 5:32 pm. The next day, the sun will show up at 6:42 am and set at 5:34 pm - three more minutes of daylight. Day three of Lent (February 24) brings another three minutes of daylight. Day four – two more minutes. And it goes on like this, each day gaining two or three additional minutes of daylight.

Suppose that, however we choose to experience Lent, we consider living into this “lengthening light” by, somehow, stretching our souls in such a way that the “Light of the World” can enter in to bring us new life, to

take us more fully into faith and more boldly into the world. Suppose we take it, like the lengthening days, just a little bit at a time, step by step. By the time Easter comes around, we will be experiencing a full hour and 22 minutes more of daylight – eighty-eight more minutes of sun light. If we've started our Lenten discipline with the same intentional but small steps and build them up each day, by the time the forty days emerge into Easter, we've expanded our faith practice into something meaningful and spirit enhancing as we embrace resurrection and the fulfillment of God's love.

May your Lengthening be blessed with God's grace!

Volunteer for your favorite cause

Say "Thank you" to the people in your life that have made a difference for you or others

Confirmation Class

As a conclusion to this unit on the church, the students are expected to attend our Annual Congregational Meeting on January 29th.

During the month of February, our unit will focus on our Spiritual Life Ministry. We will be learning about baptism and communion and will be preparing to design and lead the worship for February 19th. As Lent begins, we will take a break from our classes so the students can attend some of the Lenten services. We will resume classes after Easter and make the final preparations for Confirmation Sunday in May.

Adult Sunday Forum



Through February, the Adult Forum will be exploring some of the basic (but sometimes confusing and misunderstood) teachings of the Christian Faith. In January, we laid the groundwork for the series and explored the concept of Salvation. Topics to be explored in upcoming classes include: Sin, Forgiveness and Repentance, The Rapture and the Second Coming, John 3:16, Born Again, Believing and Faith and others. Our Ministries, and the choir will provide the main course for our potluck dinners. An RSVP slip will be included in each Sunday's bulletin. Please RSVP to the church office by Monday morning so that a correct count can be given to the cooks

Camp Scholarship policy

Congregational United Church of Christ Neenah/Menasha (CUCCNM) Camp Scholarship program adopted by the Board of Christian Education in January 2010 states that all campers will receive a minimum camp scholarship of 25% of camp fees (after all conference scholarship money has been applied). **Due to financial limitations CUCCNM will award scholarships to only one camp experience each per summer session (scholarships for weekend retreats throughout the year are subject to available funds and will be at the discretion of the Camp Scholarship Fund sub-ministry).** Campers may earn up to 50% of scholarship money if they are active stewards in the life of the church. Active stewards in the life of the church includes, but is not limited to: regular attendance at Sunday school, worship, and youth group, singing in the choir, lighting the candles, providing special music, ushering, or participating in the outreach and mission projects of the church.

In order to be considered for a camp scholarship applicants must turn in a copy of their registration form to the Christian Education Director; it will be assumed that if no application is turned in the camper wishes to not receive a scholarship.

It is also the expectation of the Camp Scholarship sub-ministry (who falls under the umbrella of the Ministry of Faith Development) that a summary of the camper's experience in the form of a letter, drawing, or a collection of pictures be sent to or dropped off at the church to show the camper's appreciation for the scholarship money received through the generous donations of the members of CUCCNM.

Ministry of Service



One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS)

Our special offering in February is One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS). OGHS, as a part of Our Church's Wider Mission, is one of the special mission offerings of the United Church of Christ and provides hope to people in more than eighty countries, including in the United States and Canada. The UCC works with international partners, and together we provide support to health education, refugee, agricultural and emergency related initiatives.

From the beginning this has been an ecumenical effort. Church World Service, a division of the National Council of Churches, and its overseas partner churches and church councils are often the first on the scene following a disaster of natural or human origin. Local church leaders identify the needs of their people. Priorities are set to bring long-term solutions that will improve the quality of life for individual and communities around the world. Nearly 50 years old, OGHS continues to respond to need equally critical as when it was first created.

Please give generously to OGHS in February. Matching funds of 50% from the Good Samaritan fund will make your donation even greater. Any donations exceeding our 2011 giving of \$2075 will be matched at 100%.
