Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.
(Isaiah 43:18 – 19)

I like new things. I like being outside after a rainstorm because everything looks new and fresh. I like newly fallen snow that blankets the ground and sparkles in the moonlight. I like new ideas with all their potential and possibilities.

Recently, a church where a friend of mine serves moved into a “new” facility. It’s not really “new” new, but it’s new to them. It’s in a former office/store front. For fifteen years, they’ve been meeting in local schools. Every Sunday they’d take all their supplies and equipment to the school cafeteria, unload, set-up and have Sunday School and worship and then pack it all up again until the next week when they would do it all over again.

Now, they won’t have to do that because they are in a new place. They can leave things in place from week to week. They can have church gatherings any time they want. They can hold Sunday School classes in actual rooms instead of the corners of a school cafeteria. They can paint and decorate and put up signs. It’s great and it’s new. There’s a great spirit in the air. God is indeed doing a new thing.

New things *are* exciting. I can just imagine the hope and dreams of my friend and his congregation as they begin this new phase of their ministry.

But new things aren’t always “things.” Sometimes the new “thing” that God is about to do has more to do with un-“thing” things - like spirits, attitudes, hopes and dreams – the kinds of things that can certainly be inspired by something like a new place of worship. But what if you already have a nice place to worship? What if there are plenty of nice “things” in that place of worship? What if the new thing that God is attempting to do is within the heart and soul of the congregation and its members? What if the new thing that God is about to do has something to do with the church itself (and I’m not talking about the brick and mortar church). What if the new thing that God is about to do has something to do with how we think about church and God and faith?

Anthony Robinson, the keynote speaker at the Northeast Association Annual meeting this past April wrote an article that I recently shared with the Ministry Council. The title of the article is “Changing the Conversation: Nurturing a third Way for Congregations.” In it, he talks about four chambers of a new heart that many churches may need in order to move forward in the right direction:

1. Evangelism starts at home: before we can share the Good News of what God is doing in Jesus, we need to hear it ourselves and it may be that we need to hear it in new ways.

2. God: trust that God is living, powerful, vital, and capable of changing, healing, and delivering us.
3. Scripture: recognize that scripture is the trustworthy mediation of the living God and not simply "great literature."
4. Theology: It's not just for professionals anymore! The church needs a new heart where *all* people of the church engage the core convictions of Christianity and the differences they might make in the world.

Like allowing ourselves to step out after the rain or tread across the newly fallen snow, congregations that allow God to create a new heart within them are renewed and become instruments through which lives are transformed, energy is produced and new and vital forms of mission emerge.

There were many other valuable and important points that Robinson lifted up in his article but he concluded by pointing out that all this "newness" takes both urgency and patience – urgency because the church can't wait to be transformed and yet we must be patient with one another and our leaders. New skills need to be learned. Old structures will need to give way while the yet unknown ones are taking shape. We don't have the answers in advance. We learn as we go. But, we do not go alone. As in all time, God goes before us and with us.

2011 Northeast Association UCC Annual Meeting

This year's meeting was held at 1st Congregational UCC, Appleton on Saturday, April 30; I had the privilege of attending as a delegate. Experiencing worship at the wider church events is always a most uplifting and heart-warming feeling. 138 delegates, pastors, and visitors attended.

Key topics of discussion were the changes to the roles of the Association Ministers, approval of the newly elected ministry positions and the financial reporting. The keynote speaker, Anthony B. Robinson, opened our eyes (and ears) to a "changing conversation" that churches need to be engaged in to thrive and live out their purpose.

My take-away from the message of the speaker was that we, the people of God, need to define our purpose and live it out. Live it out in every aspect of our lives (church, home, work, community.) And when others see the impact of our purpose, lived out in every day terms, it is then that we grow in faith and share the purpose of why we continue to return week after week to the place that gives us the strength and increases our faith and of all that we interact with. It isn't the way we are structured or what programs we have or how much money we have (or don't have) – but rather how we live our lives through our purpose.

Is our purpose based on the teachings of the Bible or is our purpose based on how many programs we have and how we are structured? Do we need to change our conversation? It is but a fine balance between the two, and in UCC fashion, we will continue the conversation so we continue on our journey "no matter where we are."

Pastor Lynne led an excellent "Mission Moment" of "*Hearing, Telling, Participating*". She had three people witness their experiences of mission. This was so very touching, moving and inspiring. There were workshops to attend, books you could buy and of course...EAT...always the 'eats'...that must be "UCC" thing no matter which church you are in.

Building & Grounds

Busy Spring for Building and Grounds Team

The Building and Grounds crew completed many special outdoor projects during the spring and early summer. Among those were:

- Replacing an inoperative sump pump
- Cleaning the sump pits that were full of mud, sand, and debris
- Pumping to avoid damage to the woods and neighboring areas
- Excavating a ditch, installing drain tile, removing clay and placing crushed rock under the sidewalk to alleviate ponding of water in the spring

A lot of indoor activity was also completed:

- Preparing the kitchen for installation of the residential-size dishwasher
- Installing the dishwasher and building a counter cover for it
- Cleaning the kitchen and several doors and windows during the spring cleanup
- Putting Panic Bars on three more doors
- Installing the Hi Rise toilets that were donated in each bathroom
- Putting a timer on the hot water heater re-circulating pump to reduce energy usage

Erv Wegner and the Landscaping team have been hard at work making the church grounds look beautiful. Erv repaired the steps in the wooded worship area and also prepared the former tree removal sites and planted grass. He and Dave Day do the weekly grass clipping. The Landscaping team – Erv, Laurie Kleist, Mary Liesch, and Deb Murphy (who helps during the summer) - meets most Wednesday mornings. They invite anyone who is interested to join them.

Erv also coordinated the Hearing Loop project, and its installation in the sanctuary was completed in June.

There are many folks to thank for their efforts to keep our church building and grounds beautiful, clean, safe, and in working order. Special thanks to Kevin Shumann, Erv Wegner, Dave Day, Doug Botten, Otto Jaeger and the Spring Cleanup team of Ginny Stutzman, Barb Peperkorn, Laurie Kleist, Linda Stoll, Marcie Fry, Jodie Eisch and Pastor Lynne.
