I invite you to walk with me into a tender moment....

Ten years ago, like many of you, I watched the towers of the World Trade Center in New York burn and fall, an image that has been burned into the memory of our nation forever. I called my children, both in college at the time, to make sure they were safe. I wondered what was to come.

Eighteen months later, after weeks of praying for a peaceful solution, my heart was broken and my faith took a beating when the United States invaded Iraq. I had signed a letter, along with thousands of other UCC members and pastors, urging President George W. Bush not to take our country into another war. Some think that I was opposed to the war because my daughter was in ROTC in college and was expecting to be active in the Army upon her graduation. Some were against going into Iraq because we were already fighting in Afghanistan. But it was more than that. My passion for non-violence ultimately stems from how I have come to understand Jesus and strive to walk in the way of his teachings. So, on March 20, 2003, when I learned that we had sent troops into Iraq, I was stunned. How could this God of love and justice, this Prince of Peace, not have heard our pleas for a peaceful, non-violent solution?


Recently, I heard Christopher Grundy sing a song about his reflections of two years after 9/11/01. He sang about "that year" as the year that all things changed. It was a song of peaceful solutions and reconciliation, not a song of war and violence. It was a song that was very much not what our experience has been. It was a song that reflected the message of hope found in Isaiah and Jeremiah except that instead of things hoped for, they were things that had become reality... wolves living with lambs, swords into plowshares... those kinds of things. It was a song that reflected all for which I have longed but not realized. I was sad and I wept. I wept for the tireless prayers that have gone forth since 9/11/01. I wept for the lives that were lost on that day as well as those that have been lost in battle since. I wept for the children who will grow up without the fathers and mothers who have died in war. I wept for the children who have died in war. I wept for all those who have been left with wounded bodies and souls as a result of war. I wept for the divisions within our country that perpetuate a culture of hostility.

How many times I have wanted to "give up" on all of the hoping and praying for peaceful solutions. But Christopher's song and the message of the gospel just won't let me- for they reflect not just my hopes but God's dream for the world. And how can we give up on God's dream?

We will light candles and sing songs. And, we will share in the Lord's Supper, a remembrance of the new covenant of God's love that is offered to all. This will all take place during our regular worship time at 10:15 am. So come. Bring friends and neighbors. Come to remember and renew. Come for tender moments. Come for strength to continue to live into God's dream.

The passage is called Paul's second prayer to the Ephesians. The Ministry of Stewardship has selected this prayer as the inspiration for our stewardship campaign this fall. We are seeking stories, comments, speeches, or thoughts on how your faith is an integral part in your life. How do you describe the breadth, length, height and depth of God's love?
