Being Christian – doing things together

When I was a teenager and young at being a Christian (this was actually before I was baptized), there was a girl in our youth group that was smart and witty and could recite lines from movies from memory, sometimes after seeing them only once. This is always amazing to me since I can't even recite lines from movies I've seen dozens of times. One of the lines that she remembered and recited often (although it wasn't from a movie but probably from a bumper sticker... and I can't recall them either) was "Going to church makes me no more a Christian that living in a garage makes me a car."

At the time, when I was all of 15 or 16 and new at this church thing and longing to be impressive to people who could recite lines of movies, I loved this. Which is odd because I was really getting into going to church. I loved the songs, the liturgy, the acceptance, the fact that there was a "teenage heaven" section on the front row way over to the right side of the sanctuary. On any given Sunday, there would be anywhere from 4 to 12 teenagers sitting in this pew participating in worship... really participating not just hanging out because it was something their parents made or expected them to do. In fact, most of our parents were seldom, if ever in church. This was something that was totally of our doing, inspired perhaps by a little bit of our own version of peer pressure. Some kids get pressured into doing drugs and drinking by their friends. I got pressured into going to church by mine.

My friend's little quip about church and garages is absolutely true. Going to church will not make you a Christian but I can't imagine being a Christian without going to church. It has something to do with the fact that Jesus didn't inspire a bunch of individuals who went out and did their own thing. He inspired communities. He taught them how important it was to care, not just for each other but for all the others, and how important it was to do that as a group. Most of the time when he said "you" it wasn't in the sense that it was "you" as in "only you" but more like "you all." Christianity isn't about this personal pact that any one individual has with Jesus. It's about the formation of a community of people as we try to figure out how to be the body of Christ in the world as it is. Christianity at its best, as Nadia Bolz-Weber puts it, subverts individualism "by being joined to other people through God."

We can be individual students of Christ but to be a Christian means that we commit ourselves to do be students with others, in a class, as a group, as a community. We learn from each other, not just those that sit with us in the pew and doze and wonder and make notes in the margins of the bulletin and

check emails and Facebook and pray but with all those that have come before us and who will come after us. Because this is such a communal thing, when we make the claim that we can go it alone or that we don't need to go to church, we're really disregarding all of those who have made sure that there would be a church for us and not thinking about those who will need the church after us. When we say we don't need the church, we're really dissing all those great and wonderful people. It's like spending years going to the dentist and getting all of the dental and orthodontic stuff taken care of and looking in the mirror at your nice straight, white teeth and saying, "I don't need the dentist."

And the whole garage and car thing, my friend was right – living in the garage will never make me a car. But I can guarantee you that if I lived in a garage, I would understand my car a whole lot better and I might take care of it better. So take that analogy and turn it back to the church. Going to church won't make you a Christian, that's God's job. But going to church will certainly help you understand this Jesus stuff a whole lot better and perhaps even make you a better Christian because you'll be living in God's garage where Christians hang out and learn from one another and work hard together to make God-stuff happen inside as well as outside of the church. Going to church will help you better understand Christianity. And, yes, going to church will make you a better Christian.

At the last Congregational Annual Meeting on January 31, our Open and Affirming (ONA) Committee asked the congregation to let them know what other information you would want to know and what questions do you still have regarding Open and Affirming. On Thursday, March 10, Pat Blades, a member at First Congregational Church in Oshkosh will be our guest at a listening session at 7:00 pm. Pat will be prepared to talk about their process and how being ONA has impacted their church. This will also be a time for you to raise other questions and continue the conversation.

There will be a second listening session on Sunday, March 13 following worship. This will be a listening session for our members to have further conversation, ask questions and share stories.

Lake Edge Update

For over 45 years, the church has supported Lake Edge Preschool through the use of facilities and financial record keeping. Although the relationship between the church and Lake Edge has not been real close, the church has always seen Lake Edge as part of our service to the community in that it provides a quality preschool program. As with all things, change happens. Enrollment has been down and staff members are retiring or moving on to other opportunities. Last year, there was the possibility that Lake Edge may need to close its doors at the end of the 2015-2016 school year. However recent events have led to the decision to keep things going. Inquiries indicate the enrollment may be up and some of the teaching staff have decided to remain. Lake Edge will exist as we know it for at least one more year!

And there's more... One of the things that we learned from the New Beginnings process that we completed a little over year ago and have been exploring ways to live into is to use our resources to meet the needs of the community around us. We have learned that there is a significant need for child care and early childhood education (preschool). We have begun exploring what it would take to expand Lake Edge into a full daycare and preschool and will continue to do so for the coming months. With Lake Edge able to continue in its current mode of operation for one more year, we have some breathing room to discern more completely just what the future of Lake Edge will be. Kitchen Maintenance



CHURCH KITCHEN

ALL OF THE CABINETS AND DRAWERS HAVE BEEN LABELED. PLEASE RETURN ITEMS TO THEIR LABELED HOME SO OTHERS CAN FIND THEM WHEN NEEDED. (LABEL MAKER IN TOP DRAWER OF CENTER COUNTER NEAREST THE DOORS –Please use as needed to replace worn or lost labels)

As we are in the middle of Lenten Pot Luck dinners, the church kitchen is well used. Hopefully, it will be **well cleaned** as well!! (If you are not able to clean up after an event, please ask someone else to take care of the clean-up.) There is no one responsible for regular cleaning of the kitchen. It is hoped that, like your kitchen at home, you will take responsibility to do some extra cleaning whenever you have a few minutes – maybe waiting for something to cook, finishing some set-up task or whenever you might be waiting for something or someone at church.

The “home- type” dish washer is available for items that fit and are not made of wood. SHARP KNIVES become dull with the extra heat of the dishwasher. Dirty dishes **MUST** be rinsed thoroughly since they often stay in the dishwasher days or sometimes weeks before there is a full load.

There is a “dial” on the front to indicate if the dishes are “clean” or “dirty”. If clean, please remove and return to their labeled “home.”

If you have a few extra minutes (or hours!) please do some extra cleaning where you see a need. There is a list of tasks and tips for cleaning on the kitchen bulletin board. Please sign and date list after the task is completed.

Cleaning information is posted on the bulletin board in the kitchen. There is a plan to also post the info next to each of the areas .For example: Look for refrigerator cleaning info on the refrigerator.

PLEASE LEAVE CHURCH KITCHEN AS CLEAN OR CLEANER THAN YOU FOUND IT.

NOTE: When ever items are “borrowed” from the church kitchen, please leave a note in the place where the item was located with your name, telephone, date borrowed, and date item will be returned. Also, inform the church office.

Beer and the Bible (B&TB) is an adult discussion group that meets monthly at a local eating establishment to discuss current issues or topics related to faith. News from Lake Edge




