978,000 is a big number... a really big number. It's really close to a million. When I think about how much 978,000 is, I think about abundance and fullness and blessing. Probably because I am not one of the 978,000 people in the state of Wisconsin who are living at or below the federal poverty level. For each one of those 978,000 people who might be my friends and neighbors, this number represents struggle, anxiety, need, perhaps even hunger, homelessness and the challenge to obtain basic goods and services like health care and car repairs.

I've never known what it is like to live in poverty. There have been times in my life that money has been tight but to go from day to day with a lingering sense of financial insecurity has not been a part of my reality.

One of the things that Jesus seems to have done so well is to step into the midst of people's lives where they were. If we understand Christ to be a human manifestation of God, that means that God became human and stepped into the reality of being human. It's called incarnation. When we look at what we know of Jesus, we find that the kind of human that God chose to be was one who was poor.

Part of being followers of Christ is to serve the poor, feed the hungry, clothe the naked, give shelter to those without and show compassion and mercy in all things. But what if we were able to follow those holy footsteps into poverty itself to have a better understanding of the reality of the nearly 1,000,000 people in the state of Wisconsin and 45.3 million across the United States who live in poverty?

On Sunday, September 20th, we will have the opportunity to do just that. Through a poverty simulation, we will spend a brief period of time walking through some of what our friends, neighbors and relatives do on a daily basis. Together with members of First United Methodist Church, Neenah-Menasha, we are hosting a Poverty Simulation. Everyone is invited to participate, although the simulation is not recommended for youth under high school age. Participants will play the role of a member of a family who is living in poverty or that of someone who works or volunteers for a business or agency that provides goods and services.

The simulation itself will be facilitated by CAP (Community Action Program) Services out of Stevens Point. There will be a light soup lunch at 11:30 am. During the lunch some of the participants will be trained for some specific roles they will play. The simulation itself will begin at 12:30 and run until approximately 3:30.

Pre-registration is required and can be done by contacting the church office or registering on-line at <http://goo.gl/forms/kTxp5lqlu8>. In order for the simulation to be effective we have to have more than 40 people but no more than 100. Invitations to participate have been offered to churches in the Fox Valley as well as agencies that provide goods and services for those living in poverty. Don't forget to invite your friends, neighbors and family to participate as well.

Please consider joining with me and your brothers and sisters in Christ to walk, for just a short while, in the shoes of the 43.5 million people who are living in poverty in the United States. If God could do it for a lifetime, we should be able to for 3 hours on a fall afternoon.

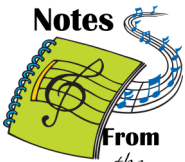

A 201st Habitat House Update

In October we begin building the 201st Habitat House in the Greater Fox Cities area! It's time to be thinking about rolling up our sleeves, putting on safety goggles and getting ready to go to work!

The sign up process will begin soon so we thought it would be helpful to share the dates and tasks so you can plan accordingly. A lot of the work days are during the week. This would be a great way to spend a day or two of your vacation! Don't forget to check with your employer. Many companies provide a "service day off" (with pay) if you are engaged in a local service project. If they don't, perhaps you could encourage them to do so! Don't worry, if you see something you'd like to do but have never done it before, Habitat will be providing skilled crew members to teach you everything you need to know for each day's build.

A typical work day schedule is:

- 7:30 am – Volunteers arrive onsite & fill out paperwork at the site support (picnic) table
- 7:45 am – Morning meeting and devotions
- 9:30 am – Mid-morning coffee break
- Noon – Lunch
- 3:30 – 4:00 pm – finish tasks and clean up

Job descriptions for volunteers:

Crew members: volunteers provided by us. No special skills are required!

Site Support: non-construction volunteer onsite who serves as host/hostess of the worksite. Tasks include: bringing ice & water needed for the workday, greeting and registering volunteers, all onsite paperwork, preparing beverages, assisting with meal service (but NOT providing the meal), running errands, organizing tools and materials onsite, keeping the site clean & safe, assisting with first-aid & emergencies and other tasks as assigned.

Meal Provider: A person or group who prepares and serves lunch to the volunteer crew.

**CUCCNM to Host Ecumenical/Community Poverty Simulation
Sunday, September 20
11:30 am – 3:00 pm (approximate ending time)
(Facilitated by CAP Services)**

As a community of faith, we are committed to serve the poor and do what we can to alleviate poverty in our midst. But how well do we understand the realities of living in poverty?

Together with other churches and community members, you are invited to join in a Poverty Simulation experience where you will have the opportunity to experience the virtual realities of poverty in a unique way.

Facilitated by CAP Services (Community Action Program), the poverty simulation is designed to help people better understand the realities of poverty. It will also help participants experience the complexities and frustrations of living in poverty day to day. The hope is that, with a greater awareness of its impact, we can more effectively address poverty issues in our community.

Participants will role-play the lives of low-income families. Some are recipients of assistance, some are disabled, and others are senior citizens on Social Security. They have the stressful task of providing for basic necessities and shelter on a limited budget during the course of four 15-minute “weeks.” They interact with human service agencies, grocers, pawnbrokers, bill collectors, job interviewers, police officers and others.

More than 13% of Wisconsin households are living at or below the federal poverty level, according to the U. S. Census Bureau. An additional 4% of individuals have incomes just above the poverty level. These total more than 978,000 people in Wisconsin struggling to meet their basic needs.

A light lunch will be served at 11:30 am and the simulation will begin at 12:15 pm. Since there is a limited number of participants allowed for each simulation, we are asking that people register. Please contact the church office at office@cuccnm.org or 725-4873 if you would like to attend. When you register, please indicate if you will be attending as a family participant (playing the role of a low-income family member) or a resource participant (playing the role of agency staff member). Training for resource participants will take place during lunch on the day of the event. If you have any questions, please contact Pastor Lynne at pastor@cuccnm.org or 725-4873.

A follow-up Educational Course on Poverty is being developed. Watch for further details.

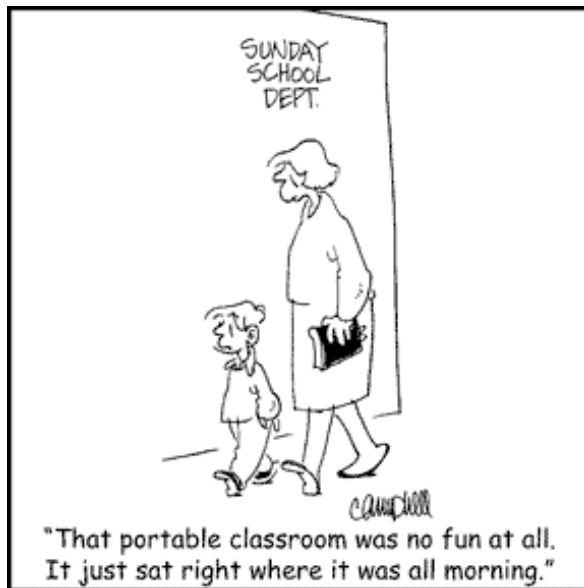
